58th Battalion in France.*



He was killed in Action 17/9/1917.

Corporal Robert Bruce Brock

*Son of M^r and M^{rs} Thomas Brock of
Robinson Street, Dandenong. Enlisted 8/5/1915,
and served in Egypt and France in the 24th
Battalion. He returned home 30/4/1919.*



HONOR ROLL

Private Victor Stanley Burns

*Nephew of Mr and Mrs F. W. Swords of Dandenong
Enlisted September 1916 in the 59th Battalion
and served with the Machine Gun Company on the
Western Front.*



*He was killed during a raid in the Villers
Bretonneux Battle towards the close of the War.*

Private James Henry Brock

*Son of Mr and Mrs Thomas Brock of
Robinson Street, Dandenong. Enlisted 5/1/1916
and served in England and France with the 23rd
Battalion. He was wounded in France and
invalided home, and returned to Australia 23/2/1919*

*Son of Mr Ernest Bellett of Hemming Street,
Dandenong. Enlisted May 1915 and served in the
15th Machine Gun Company.*


He arrived home 20/8/1919.

Private Herbert Wallace Griffiths

*Son of Mrs A Griffiths of Lonsdale Street,
Dandenong.*



*Enlisted in March 1916 in the 22nd Battalion
and served in France until at Bullecourt he was
reported missing and later reported dead.*

Private Samuel G. C. Fawcett

*Son of Mr and Mrs William Fawcett of Close St,
Dandenong. Enlisted in July 1915 and sailed for Egypt
with the 22nd Battalion, leaving there for France in
March 1916. He was badly wounded at Pozieres in July
1916 and sent to England returning to France -/2/1917.*

*Wounded again at Bullecourt 3/5/1917, he was
again sent to England whence he was invalided home
in November 1918 and finally discharged -/1/1919, after
3 1/2 years Service.*

HONOR ROLL

Private Oswald Donald Green

† Son of Mr. Thomas Green of Thomas Street Dandenong. Enlisted and served in the 21st Battalion and died of wounds received at Hamel Wood France 4/7/1918.

Private Francis Joseph Green M. M.

Son of Mr. Thomas Green of Thomas Street Dandenong. Enlisted 1/4/1916 and served in the 39th Battalion gaining the Military Medal 24/4/1918. He arrived home 12/6/1919.

Sergeant Michael Joseph Green

Son of Mr. Thomas Green of Thomas Street Dandenong. Enlisted 21/4/1916 and served in the 3rd Division Ammunition Column as a Sergeant.

the 3rd Division Signal Company from Messines until

He died of wounds in Belgium 30/9/1917

Son of M^r. W. J. Keating of Hemmings St. Dandenong. Enlisted 7/8/1916 and served in the Railway Unit in England.

He returned home about March 1919.

South Australia.*




He was killed in Action at Bullecourt.

New Zealand Expeditionary Forces.*


*He was invalided home 19/12/1917 and finally

Gallipoli 8/8/1915.*




HONOR ROLL

Sergeant Albert Ernest Masters

Son of the late Mr. and Mrs. W. Masters of Dandenong. Enlisted 8/2/1915, left Australia with the 22nd Battalion 8/5/1915, served in Gallipoli four months, and then in the Canal Zone, fought in the trenches at Fleurbaix, Chappelle, Bullecourt, Armentieres, Ypres, Flers, Pozieres, Bapaume, and Passchendale, Narrowly escaped death being buried twice by shell bursts and having his gun blown to pieces. He broke down while in training at Cambridge England for Commission Officer and was discharged 24/3/1919. He served in the 6th Machine Gun Company.

Total service 1506 days (1364 abroad)





HONOR ROLL

Private Harry Bignell Mitchell

*Son of Mr. E Mitchell of Gordon Grove,
Malvern. Enlisted in April 1918 and served
abroad. He returned home 12/11/1919.*

HONOR ROLL

Major Kenneth Arthur McLean M.C.

Son of the late Alex. McLean of Sydney Street, Armadale. Enlisted 4/12/1916 and served in the Army Medical Corps at Messines, Ypres, and the Somme in France. He was awarded the Military Cross at Villers Bretonneux 4/4/1918, and at Clery on 31st August same year he won the distinction of a Bar to the M.C. He was promoted Major 8/8/1920.

On 31/12/1918 he sustained a gunshot wound in the right arm. He arrived home 26/12/1919.

Corporal Carden Patrick Gose McLean

Son of the late Alex. McLean of Sydney Street, Armadale. Enlisted in September 1915 in the 5th Battalion and served in Egypt, the Somme, Moquet Farm, Pozieres, and Guendecourt. Promoted Corporal August 1916. He was killed in Action at Eudecourt 6/11/1916.



HONOR ROLL

Private John McConnell

† Son of Mrs John McConnell of Dandenong.
Enlisted in May 1916 and served in France with the
21st Battalion. He was reported missing 14/4/1918
and has not been heard of since.

Account by Signaller C. A. Ingle:—

"21st Battalion was ordered to raid an enemy post
"in front. Volunteers were called for. Pte McConnell
"offered and soon after they started was 'cracked'
"but continued firing with an enemy pistol that
"he had taken from the Germans. Soon their small
"party was overpowered and McConnell either
"died fighting, or was taken prisoner."

He was reported to have been zealous and daring
in his single-handed operations against "Flare-Kings"
by means of rifle grenades, and was much talked
of in the Battalion as worthy of decoration.

Private David James McFarlane


Son of Mrs Elizabeth and the late James McFarlane of Stud Road, Dandenong.

Enlisted in June 1918 and was in camp at Broadmeadows when Armistice was signed.

Private David McDonald

Son of Mrs Mary Ellen and the late Thomas Walter McDonald of Scott St., Dandenong.

Enlisted 4/4/1916 and served in the 4th Machine Gun Battery in France. He was in Action at Messines, Ypres, Peronne and other engagements. He arrived home 2/7/1919.



HONOR ROLL

Private William Newsome

Son of Mr F. Newsome of Kidd's Road, Dandenong. Enlisted 6/11/1914 and served in the 16th Battalion. He was wounded in Gallipoli 9/8/1915 and returned home 29/7/1919.

Private Frederick Charles Newsome

Son of Mr F. Newsome of Kidd's Road, Dandenong. Enlisted 20/8/1914 and served in the 8th Battalion. He was wounded at the Landing at Gallipoli 25/4/1915 and returned home 17/9/1917. He re-enlisted 6/6/1918 and returned home -/3/1919

Private Henry Newsome

Son of Mr F. Newsome of Kidd's Road, Dandenong. Enlisted 6/11/1914 and served in the 16th Battalion. Was wounded in Gallipoli and invalided home 28/2/1916. He re-enlisted 6/6/1918 and returned home 31/5/1919.

HONOR ROLL

Sergeant Ernest Alfred Orgill

+ Son of Mrs. Orgill of Foster Street, Dandenong. Enlisted 29/6/1915 and served in the 29th Battalion. He was killed in Action at Beaumontz France 23/3/1917 and interred at Beaumontz Cross Roads Military Cemetery.

Private Percy James Orgill

Son of Mrs. Orgill of Foster Street, Dandenong. Enlisted 16/10/1916 and served in the 29th Battalion abroad. Arrived home 22/8/1919.

Sergeant Arthur Garfield Orgill


+ Son of Mrs. Orgill of Foster Street, Dandenong. Enlisted 29/6/1915 and served in the 5th Pioneer Battalion. He was killed in Action 11/4/1917 at Vaux France and interred at Vaux Hill British Cemetery.

Private Joseph Ordish

*Son of Rachel and Rowland Ordish of
McPherson Street, Dandenong. Enlisted 2/2/1916
and served in the 58th Battalion. He fought
in France at Bapaume, Bullecourt, Villers
Bretonneux, Polygon Wood, Passchendale,
Messines and Morlancourt from -/10/1916
to 21/8/1918 when he was wounded and invalided
home -/10/1918.*



HONOR ROLL

Major Harold Ordish D.S.O.

Son of Mary and Thomas Ordish of Foster St Dandenong.
Enlisted 23/2/1916. Commanded 10th Machine Gun Company from 1/5/1916 to 31/7/1917; Divisional M.G. Officer 2nd Div: 1/8/1917 to 14/3/1918 on formation of M.G. Battalions; 2nd M.G. Battalion (Company Commander) 15/3/1918 to 18/9/1918; Commandant M.G. Trg. Depôt England 19/9/1918 to 23/1/1919; O.C. Educational Centre England 24/1/1919 to 12/8/1919; O.C. Divisional Colour Parties Peace Celebrations in Paris and London 7/7/1919 to 21/7/1919. He arrived home 9/3/1920 and was demobilised from A.I.F 1/5/1920.

Promoted Lieutenant 1/4/1916; Captain 1/5/1916; Major 3/6/1917. Awarded D.S.O. 3/6/1918; In Despatches 1/6/1917, 28/12/1917, 28/5/1918, War Office Communique 28/8/1919.

Summary of Active Service:— South Africa, 1st Victorian Contingent Nov. 1899 to 1901, 6th Battalion Aust: Comm: Horse May 1902 to Aug: 1902 Serg. Major, Queen's Medal with 5 clasps viz:—Cape Colony, Orange Free State, Johannesburg, Diamond Hill, and Belfast,

Great War. Main Operations Dec. to April 1917 Armentieres, Messines, 7th to 9th June, Messines Ridge July 1917, Passchendale Nov. 1917 April to Sept: 1918;— Operations East of Amiens in vicinity of Albert, Morlancourt and Villers Bretonneux including taking of Herbecourt crossing the Somme at Clery and culminating in the taking of Mont St Quentin.


Prior to enlistment he was on Instructional Staff Aust: Military Forces.

*Son of Mr. W. J. Paydon of Dandenong.
Enlisted 1/3/1916 and served in the 3rd Australian
Pioneers as a Driver in France from 27/3/1916
until Armistice was signed.
(Active Service 1391 days)*

Lieutenant Reginald James Pickett M.C.

*Son of Marie and James Pickett of
Pickett Street Dandenong. Enlisted -/3/1915
and served in the 24th Battalion.*



*He was awarded the Military Cross 3/5/1917
and was killed in Action 9/10/1917.*


Private Malcolm Reginald Purdy

Son of William and Caroline Purdy of Melbourne Road, Dandenong. Enlisted 24/11/1916 and served in the Flying Corps as Second Air Mechanic. He returned home 20/10/1919.

Private William Osborne Purdy

Son of William and Caroline Purdy of Melbourne Road, Dandenong. Enlisted from the Gordon Technical College Geelong where he was a teacher on 19/1/1916 and served in the 6th Field Ambulance at Bullecourt, Passchendale, Hamel, and S^t Quentin to the Hindenburg Line.

He was wounded -/10/1917 and invalided home 7/6/1919.



HONOR ROLL

Driver Rupert Hamilton Rodd

*Son of Mr W. H. A. Rodd of Dandenong.
Enlisted 27/4/1917. He arrived in France
8/5/18, and served in the 29th Battery, 8th
Field Artillery Brigade (3rd Division). He
took part in engagements at Villers Bretonneux,
Hamel, and Somme offensive from that date
until the signing of the Armistice.*

He arrived home 26/8/1919.

Private George Harvey Roulston

*Son of Mr and Mrs George F. Roulston
of 12 Wheatland Road, Malvern.*

*Enlisted 22/11/1917 and served in the
Australian Flying Corps.*




HONOR ROLL

Sergeant James Walter Swords

Son of Mr and Mrs F. W. Swords of Hutton St Dandenong. Enlisted 17/5/1916 and served in the 57th Battalion latterly as Acting Sergeant on the Somme Front and at Bullecourt until stricken with trench fever at Bapaume and invalided home.

He obtained 1st Class Instructor's Certificate for Musketry and Lewis Gun at Tidworth England. He arrived home 3/1/1918





HONOR ROLL

Sergeant Oswald Henry Todd

Son of Mr. O. F. A. Todd of Robinson Street, Dandenong. Enlisted 20/7/1915 and served in the 31st Battalion in Egypt and Flanders. He arrived home 27/1/1920.



HONOR ROLL

Sergeant Alan Keith Titcher

*Son of Mr. Robert A. Titcher of
Lonsdale Street, Dandenong.*

*Enlisted 8/7/1915 and served with
the A. A. M. C. in France. He was twice
slightly wounded. He returned home
in June 1919.*



HONOR ROLL

Sergeant Harold Edward Tulloch

Son of Mr and Mrs J. L. Tulloch of Melbourne Road, Dandenong. Enlisted 17/8/1914 and served in the 8th Infantry Battalion.

He sailed from Australia with the first contingent A. I. F. He took part in the first defence of the Suez Canal from Turkish attack January 1915. He took part in the Landing in Gallipoli (promoted Sergeant next day), Cape Helles and all other engagements on the Peninsula until the end of September when he was invalided to Malta where he remained in hospital until January 1916 and then sent home unfit for further service.



HONOR ROLL

Lieutenant Harold John Edward Veal

*Son of the Rev. E. G. Veal The Rectory
Dandenong. Enlisted -/9/1915 and served in
the 29th Battalion in Egypt April to June
1916, and at Ypres and Polygon Wood. He
was promoted 1st Lieutenant in November 1916*

*He was wounded 26/9/1917 and invalided home
in January 1918 and arrived in Victoria 21/3/1918*

*He re-enlisted 21/10/1918 and served in Egypt
until the Armistice was signed.*

He returned home again 31/1/1919.




HONOR ROLL

Private Reuben George Vizard

*Son of Albert Ernest and Margaret Vizard
of Melbourne Road, Dandenong. Enlisted 25/8/1916
and served in the 39th Battalion.*

*After training at Salisbury Plain he fought
at Hill 60 and took part in the Battle of
Messines until on account of rheumatic fever
he was invalided home in November 1917.*





HONOR ROLL

Private Charles Wilfred Williams

*Son of Mrs W.A. Williams of Wilson
Street, Dandenong. Enlisted 1/3/1916 and
served as a Private until he was killed 25/9/1919*





HONOR ROLL

Private Ernest Howard Williams

*Son of Mr Ernest Williams of Dandenong.
He enlisted from Portland, Oregon, U.S.A. and
went with one of the first drafts of Canadians.*

*He was on Active Service for four years,
was wounded (not seriously) and returned to
Portland U.S.A.*



HONOR ROLL


Warrant Officer John Thomas Reedy M.M.

Son of Mrs E. Reedy and the late James Reedy of Dandenong.

Enlisted 19/7/1915 and served in the 29th Batt. in Egypt and France.

After six months' service in the Canal Zone, he was sent to France, where he took part in engagements at Fromelles, the Somme, winter 1916-17. Baupaume and Polygon Wood.

He was promoted to Warrant Officer on the 24th July 1918, and four days later was awarded the Military Medal at the capture of Morlan court Ridge. He fought in the 8th of August offensive in the Villers Bretonneux sector, and continued to serve till November when the Armistice was signed. Arrived home 26th June 1919.





HONOR ROLL

Flight Lieutenant Frank G. Toy. R. A. F.

*Enlisted June 29th 1915 with
29th Batt. Saw service in Egypt and
France. Promoted to Lieut., and later
transferred to Royal Flying Corps,
and gained Pilot's Certificate.*

*Invalided to Australia on
November 2nd 1918, and died 9 mos. later.*
